market-oriented job skills to underprivileged youth and ensuring at least 70% of the trained youth find adequate job placements.

Enabling livelihood and skill development has fostered systemic change in the society, inspiring the youth to participate in social and economic transformation of the country. We have made steady headway towards realising our commitment to catalyse employment and entrepreneurship opportunities for over 1,00,000 youth by 2026, while retaining a focus on environment sustainability. Till date, we have reached over **40,000 people** through our employability and entrepreneurship initiatives. In FY 23-24, we planted 2 lakh trees and have set a target of planting 1 million trees over the next five years. Progress across strategic focus areas (FY 2023 – 24)

At YES Foundation, we aim to inspire the youth of India to lead economic and social development by skilling themselves for market-oriented jobs and by taking to enterprise. Towards this end, we will catalyze employment and entrepreneurship opportunities for 100,000 youth by 2026, while retaining our focus on environment sustainability.

In pursuance of the focus on environment sustainability, this year we introduced an agroforestry project with a dual objective to enhance green cover and provide additional income to farmers. We planted 2 lakh trees in FY 2023-24 and aim to plant 1 million trees over the next five years.

Employability

The challenge

India's rapidly growing youth population has immense potential to make the country the skill capital of the world. With more than 65% of the youth population falling in the age bracket of 25-35 years of age, this dynamic workforce can propel India's growth to higher levels. However, due to rapid advances in technology and rise in demand for new-age skills, there is a skill gap that needs to be addressed.

Our intervention

In order to harness the demographic dividend of the country, YES Foundation has undertaken skilling program providing market-oriented job skills across various sectors to underprivileged youth and ensuring that at least 70% of the trained youth are placed. In FY 2023-24, over 4,000 youth received skills training across 6 different states. In addition to this, soft skills like communicative English, basic computers, mock interviews, resume writing, personality development and confidence building were also provided to the trainees. Learning Management Systems and supplementing classroom learning with self-paced online learning was encouraged. Sessions from industry experts played an important role in providing realistic insights and practical tips to benefit the trainees. Our employability initiatives have unlocked an economic potential of over INR 30 crores.

Our 24-year-old beneficiary, residing in Delhi, faced financial constraints due to her family's limited means. Determined to achieve independence, she seized an opportunity by enrolling at our retail sector-oriented skilling center. "This initiative provided comprehensive retail training, equipping me with skills in customer service, client interaction, interview tactics and personality development. Entrepreneurship

The challenge

Agricultural development in India is uneven, with several states facing pronounced disparities. Rising cultivation costs, inadequate price support and limited market access have compounded farmers' challenges. Besides overuse of chemicals, environmental threats and neglect of soil health have further exacerbated food insecurity and livelihood concerns. Limited knowledge of innovative agricultural practices and challenges in accessing water for irrigation throughout the year has prompted a significant portion of the population to engage in seasonal migration. Women and artisans are also susceptible to cycle of economic vulnerability and need specific interventions encompassing skill enhancement and market linkages.

Our intervention

Rural entrepreneurship is a key growth driver for any economy. YES Foundation works with small and marginalized farmers, women and artisans in Rajasthan, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Assam, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Odisha to promote sustainable livelihood by combining traditional and scientific methods. We strive to strengthen rural economies by enhancing income generation opportunities through farming extensions, agricultural inputs and promotion of handicrafts and handlooms. We have built partnerships to support and promote nano enterprises with a focus on women and farmers. With help of our on-ground partners, we reached out to over 7,000 farmers in FY 2023-24, providing training on various climate resilient farming techniques and ensuring enhanced irrigation support facilities for them. Our work in watershed development has ushered a newfound hope for these farmers and reversed migration of youth in the region.

Additionally, we provided capacity building trainings and handholding support to over 5,000 rural women and artisans to set up their nano enterprises, leading to a sustained income enhancement. Our entrepreneurship initiatives has unlocked an economic potential of over 50 crores

"We have not seen this kind of crop yield in the last 20 years", exclaims Dapubai, proudly holding the maize from her field. With an increase in the yield to 1.5 quintal this year, this duo of women farmers from Morwal village in Udaipur district of Rajasthan, Dapubai and Kusava, are excited for the next season.

"In my 2-acre plot, I used to cultivate grains and vegetables. This farming, however, only fetched me an annual income of around INR 40,000, posing a challenge to make ends meet. Thanks to interventions like mulching, drip irrigation, and training in scientific tomato cultivation, I saw a significant increase in our agricultural yields. My annual income has now risen to over INR 1.3 lakh and my elder son has also returned to the village from the city to help us with cultivating our land." - Lilaben Arvindbhai, farmer from Vangara village of Panchmahal district, Gujarat.





Environment Sustainability

The challenge

Climate change induced erratic rainfall and extreme weather events like cyclones, floods, drought and pest attacks are leading to declining agricultural yields. Agrarian and tribal communities, already struggling with debt, land degradation and uncertain prices are expected to be the worst impacted by climate change, with their incomes expected to decline by up to 25%. Some of the areas grapple with a spectrum of socio-economic and environmental adversities, from erratic rainfall patterns and water scarcity to land degradation and diminishing agricultural productivity.





Our intervention

From this year, YES Foundation started an agroforestry project in 11 states across India. This initiative will play a critical role in enhancing green cover, addressing climate change while also supporting sustainable livelihoods of farmers. The project is designed to respond strategically to the challenges induced by climate change by introducing sustainable solutions and offering comprehensive support to farming communities. By incorporating native tree plantation and adopting innovative agricultural practices, the project aims to mitigate the adverse effects of climate change and bolster the resilience of farming communities. In FY 2023-24, we planted 2 lakh trees, which have an estimated carbon sequestration potential of >1.7 lakh tonnes of CO2 over the next 20 years and target to plant 1 million trees in five years.


Continuing our efforts to support MSMEs in achieving energy efficiency, our initiative of conducting walk-through energy audits successfully reached 100 MSMEs this year. The initiative has enabled MSMEs integrate sustainability into operations, reduce their overall carbon footprint and enhance their competitiveness in terms of output and efficiency.

leading to extra energy consumption.
Repairing these panels not only helped the
unit save on electricity bills but also
conserved 26,396 kWh of electricity"



"Indal Singh, a farmer from Amas village of Gaya district in Bihar, along with his brothers, had to take on additional labour work to meet the monetary needs of their large extended family. Currently, his family's yearly income is only around INR 1-2 lakhs from sale of produce from his 7 acres of land. Indalji actively sought his enrollment when he heard of the YES Foundation's plantation project and was allocated 1700 mango, lemon and amla saplings. He is confident that he will take good care of the trees, which are already geotagged and photographed and that the fruits that will be harvested will enhance his family income by INR 3-4 lakhs."

Ecosystem Strengthening

The impact sector is a powerful ecosystem and YES Foundation plays an active role in contributing towards its growth and development. Over the year, we have partnered with leading networks and organisations to catalyze capacity building for NGOs and CSR practitioners.

Training sessions

We led sessions in partnership with leading platforms like the National CSR Network and aidbees to share our perspectives on effective proposal writing, skills based volunteering and through examples, raised awareness on intersection between CSR and the SDGs* and CSR and ESG**. Based on identified topics, we also roped in external speakers as co-chairs for sessions on implementation strategies and role of leaders in creating social impact.

Leadership development for NGOs

We engaged with Common Purpose to co-curate a leadership training for our implementation partners and also engaged with leaders across the not-for-profit sector at their India Leadership Academy.




Conferences
